









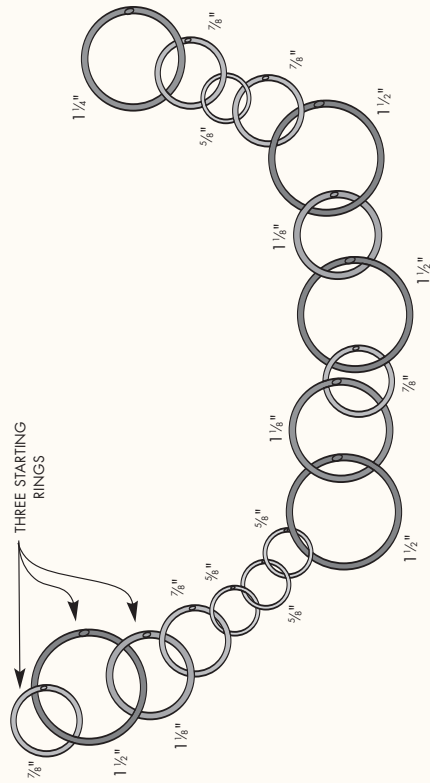
# KEY RING NECKLACE



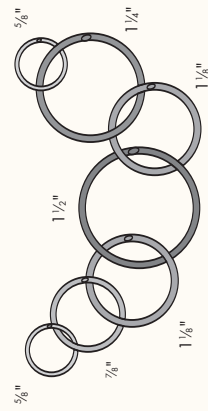
This necklace was inspired by a fine metal one my friend Emily wears. It looks great with a high-collared shirt, a low-cut scoop neck, or a button-up shirt that opens wide at the neck. The rings should sit against a plain background, allowing their connections to one another to speak for their fabulous selves.

TOOLBOX	
 <p>THREE 1 1/4" KEY RINGS</p>	 <p>FIVE 1 1/2" KEY RINGS</p>
 <p>FOUR 1 1/4" KEY RINGS</p>	 <p>SIX 7/8" KEY RINGS</p>
 <p>FIVE 1 1/2" KEY RINGS</p>	 <p>1 3/4" x 2 3/4" SPRING CLIP, CHROME FINISH</p>
INSTRUCTIONS	
 <p>7/8" KEYRING</p>	 <p>1 1/2" KEYRING</p>
<p><b>1</b> Slip a 7/8" key ring onto the end of a 1 1/2" key ring. (In other words, link the small key ring to the large key ring as if the smaller ring were a key.) <b>This is how all of the rings in the necklace connect to each other.</b></p>	

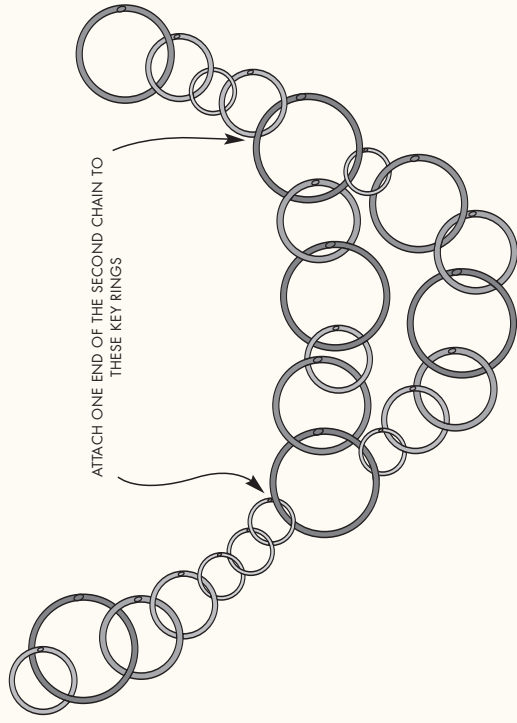
**2** Slip a  $1\frac{1}{8}$ " key ring onto the  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " key ring. Turn the rings until they are linked.



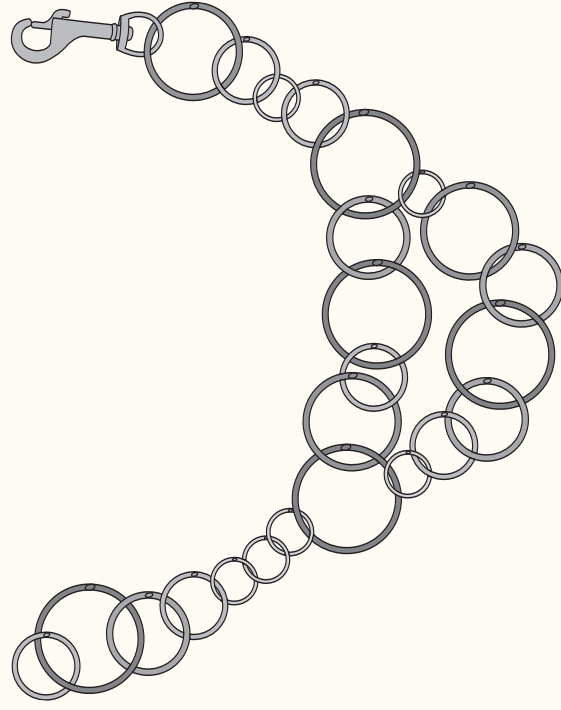
**3** Continue to link the key rings to one another in the formation shown above.



**4** When that chain is complete, put it aside and begin a new chain connected as shown.



**5** Attach the first chain to the second chain as shown above.



**6** Slip the spring clip onto the  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " ring at the end of the chain.
